Summer Camp took place from June -August. The kids had a great time with various activities, fun fieldtrips, and a 3-day camping trip to Meeks Cabin.




"THE DANA'S" EDUCATION ANNEX GRAND OPENING

Jose Echavarria was a member of the Evanston Youth Club during his formative years, and it had a big impact on his life.

"It was a second home for me, and it's good to see that so many of our kids see it as a home," said Jose, who is now a staff member of the Evanston Youth Club.

The Club quickly outgrew its first facility and space was also needed to teach life skills, job readiness, and the arts, all which were not able to adequately taught in the original facility. "The Dana's" Education Annex meets these needs and is providing opportunities for more youth like Jose. The annex honors life-long supporter and original contractor, David Gillette, who tragically passed away in December 2021. A special thanks to all the donors and contractors who diligently worked to bring this project in on schedule and under budget in David's honor.

- Improvement of Self: Attend two Club leadership programs, one public speaking class, and one team building/collaboration class
- Provide 4 hours of service to club or other community organization AND attend a City Council or County Commissioners meeting.
- Write a paragraph bio about themselves
- Write and recite an essay of "Why I am a Warrior" to a panel of judges.

Congratulations to all of our youth of the year participants and thank you to our panel of judges. The winner was announced at our Annual Dinner and received \$1,000.
